Who We Are

Salty Dogs Senior Animal Rescue is a foster based non-profit rescue focused on the adoptions of senior animals 6 years and older. Our dogs come to us through owner surrender, animal control and other shelters.

We are not a brick and mortar, but instead working as a collaborative group of volunteers to intake and adopt out through home-based care.

Our animals receive all necessary vaccinations and medical treatment prior to adoption.

How We Started

With our years of animal shelter experience and passion for homeless animals, we came together to start a foster-based animal rescue. We sensed the need and value of a true home environment to help ease the transition toward adoption. This would also provide animals with a loving foster family – some of them experiencing the sense of home for the first time.

With these intentions in mind, Salty Dogs Senior Animal Rescue was formed! We are a 501(c)(3) funded solely by the generosity of the community through donations and support. Salty Dogs' goals are to help rehome older animals, provide information to the community on the care of their senior pets, and assist in including their pets in estate plans. We are thrilled at the enthusiasm and support our venture has already received and look forward to the many furry lives we will affect. Remember, "age is just a number"!

The First Six Months

Although the idea of a rescue first formulated in the late months of 2021, it wasn't until April of 22 that we really started making headway. Mid May found us with rescuing our first dog and mascot "Walter"! How ironic that our first rescue would come to resemble our logo (this was definitely not planned, but was clearly a good sign). Since then, we have been able to rescue 20 dogs and 13 have been adopted.

We have established a website, a volunteer base and a foster base, as well as partnering with local area vets to get our animals their necessary medical requirements. When we started, our goal was to foster maybe 1 or 2 dogs a month, but we have had such overwhelming response that we have taken off much faster than we could have ever dreamed. Anyone working or volunteering in rescue work knows the commitment required, and how hard it is to say no to even 1 animal in need. We are so grateful to everyone who has decided to take this journey with us and are excited for the future of Salty Dogs.

ESTATE PLANNING

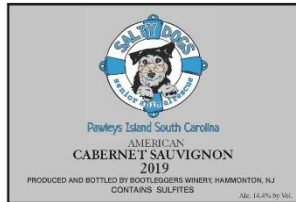

Coming Soon - Salty Dog's Wine!

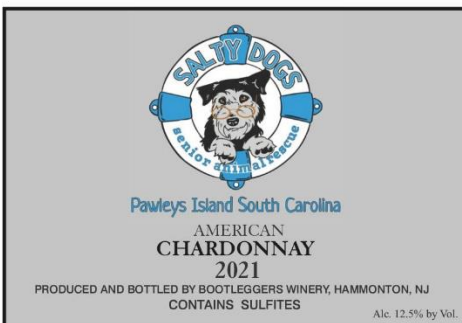

Dog Safety; The Benefits of a Harness

When it comes to taking your dog for a walk it should be an enjoyable experience for both you and the dog. What do you use to take your dog on a walk? Have you ever considered a harness? A harness provides many benefits for your dog's safety as well as making a walk easier. Here are just a few of the reasons a harness is a great tool.

More Control: Harnesses offer support to the neck, chest, back and legs. Because harnesses support more of the dog's body, the harness gives the handler more control of movement. Instead of only holding your dog back from the neck, owners are able to hold their dog by most of their body. This is especially helpful for big, muscular dogs who have the strength to intensely pull whoever is at the other end of the leash.

Discourages Pulling: Front-clip harnesses are especially helpful to discourage your dog's pulling. The chest ring allows the handler to redirect and steer the dog's attention by requiring the dog to turn around instead of pulling them back. Dogs aren't able to pull with a front clipped harness because they are forced to turn around. Additionally, harnesses trick dogs into thinking that they are pulling, when they really aren't.

Prevents Injuries: Walking with just a collar directs all the stress to the neck. Some dogs are very delicate, so a harness that allows an even distribution of pressure may help prevent injuries. They also cause less restriction for breeds prone to respiratory problems or tracheal collapse (i.e., pugs, French bulldogs). Using a harness may even help with your own safety! Since it discourages pulling, your dog is less likely to cause strain and stress on your arm. In addition, harnesses make it harder for your dog to tangle their leash around you. We've all experienced an excited dog. They may

accidentally wrap their leash around your legs, arms, fingers, etc., and cause an injury. Fortunately, harnesses make it more difficult for your dog to tangle you up.

Difficult to Escape Out of: Some dogs transform into little escape artists when on a walk. If motivated enough by that squirrel they just saw spring across the grass, dogs can wriggle out of their collars when on a leash. Other dogs with thin faces, like Greyhounds, have the ability to simply slip out of their collars. Harnesses make it much harder for a crafty dog to escape.



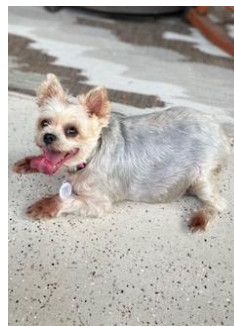
One of the highly recommended harnesses is the Freedom No-pull harness by 2 hounds. Visit www.2houndsdesign.com, to learn more. Additionally, when using a harness or a collar, it's important that your dog is always wearing identification tag. Accidents happen; microchips are important but they aren't the catch all solution. Whatever harness or collar you choose to use, ensuring the correct fit is vitally important. If it's not fitted correctly, then it won't work as it's designed. Ensure you get assistance with fitting or measuring as well as specific recommendations for breeds with unique body types such as dachshunds and Italian greyhounds.
